

Daryl Copeland is an analyst, author, and educator specializing in diplomacy, foreign policy, global issues and public management. His first book, Guerilla Diplomacy: Rethinking International Relations, was released in July 2009 by Lynne Rienner Publishers.

<u>Evan H. Potter</u> is assistant professor in the Department of Communication, University of Ottawa. He is founding editor of the Canadian Foreign Policy journal and a former Fulbright Visiting Chair in Public Diplomacy at the Annenberg School for Communication, University of Southern California. He is also a former senior strategist in the Communications Bureau at the Canadian Department of Foreign Affairs and International Trade and the author of *Cyberdiplomacy: Foreign Policy in the 21<sup>st</sup> Century*.
